What is a symbol?





The Australian Aborigines used many different symbols in their art.

The indigenous Australians lived in Australia long before white Europeans came to settle there. The Aborigines lived in tribes and lived off the land. Nature was very important to them as it was through nature that they were able to survive. Art was very important to the indigenous Australians too. They used art to tell their stories. These artistic stories were passed down through generations. Art was also a way of communicating with the spirit world.







The Aborigines created artwork in lots of different ways. They painted symbols and patterns on leaves, tree bark, rocks, tools and their bodies. They also created sand paintings and sculptures.









Most Aboriginal paintings are created using dots. This is because they didn't have paintbrushes so had to use their fingers, sticks and twigs instead.







There are still lots of Aborigines today who produce beautiful artwork. Some Australians who didn't descend from the indigenous Australians also like to create Aboriginal art too.
