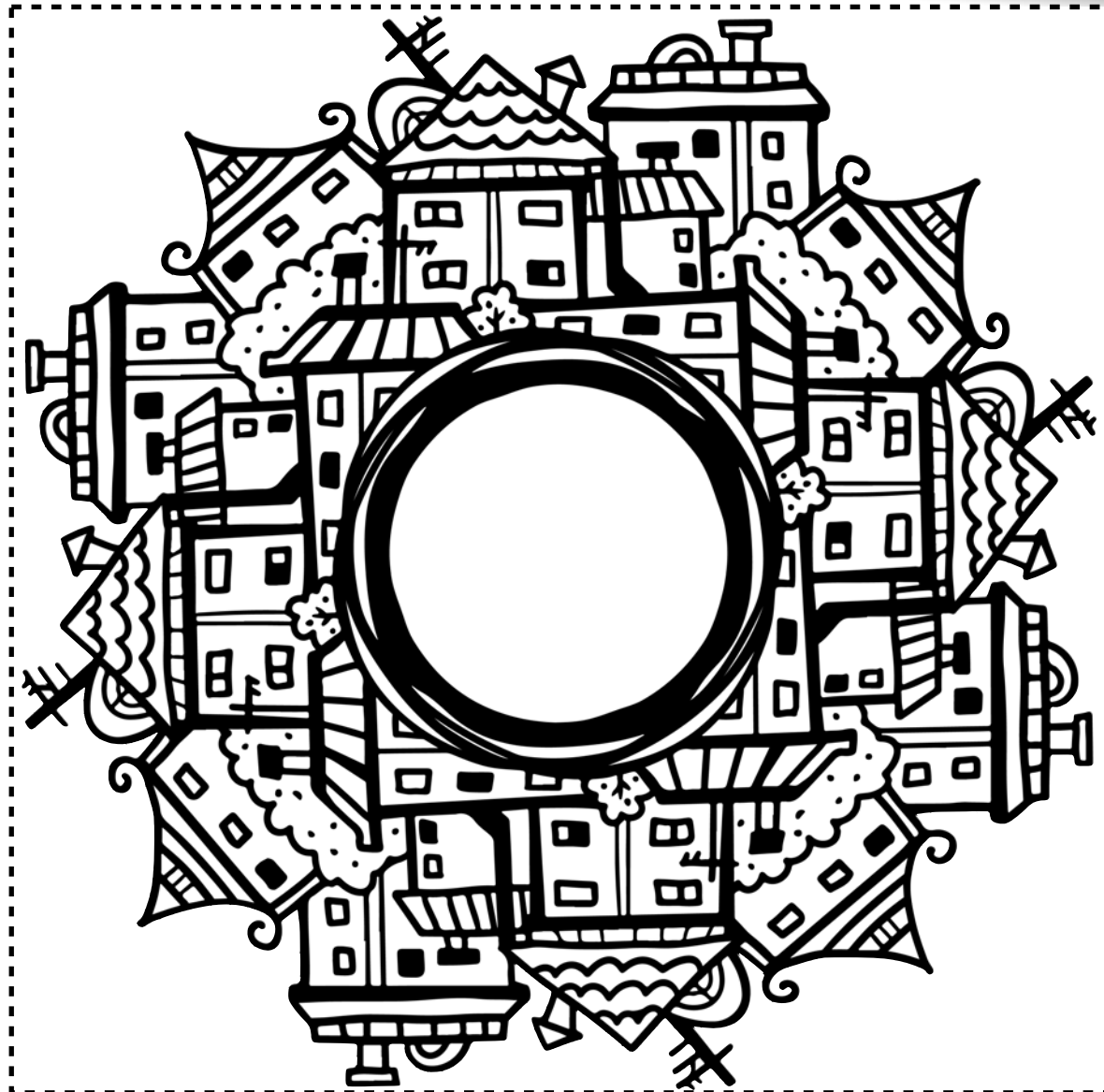


3D Pop art



1. Colour this image using bright, bold colours. Think about the colours Fazzino used in his cityscapes.
2. Cut out the image and glue it onto black card.
3. Trace around the trees and some of the roofs on thin, white paper. Colour these objects the same colour as the original.
4. Cut out these extra drawings and glue them on top of the original. Remember to glue scrunched-up newspaper onto the cut-out image first, so it will create a second layer.
5. Glue on some crystals and sequins to add to the 3D effect.



3D Pop art



1. Colour in these houses and objects using bright bold colours.
2. On an A3 piece of paper draw an island, rock, mountain or round object of your choice on the bottom half of the page. Colour it in.
3. Cut out the houses and objects and glue scrunched-up balls of newspaper to the back.
4. Piece your buildings and objects together onto the round object, to create a cityscape.
5. Glue on some crystals and sequins to add to the 3D effect.

3D Pop art

1. Use these examples of Fazzino's cityscapes to design your own 3D cityscape.
2. On an A3 piece of paper, sketch your cityscape. Make sure you use a ruler.
3. Colour in your cityscape using bright, bold colours.
4. Choose some buildings and objects in your design to make 3D.
5. Trace over the chosen objects and colour them identical to the original. Then cut them out.
6. Glue scrunched-up newspaper to the back of the cut-out images.
7. Glue these cut-outs carefully on top of the original drawing.
8. Glue on some crystals and sequins to add to the 3D effect.
