<p><b>Homework:</b> Children are expected to read 5x per week for 20 mins. This should be recorded in their Homework Planner and signed weekly by a parent/adult. Homework for Maths and English are set on a Monday and should be completed by Friday. Spelling lists are set weekly. Each task should take no longer than 20 minutes or longer if a child is happy to continue. On occasion, science, topic or art homework may be set. We encourage parents to support their child with their learning as much as possible. <b>Homework club</b> will take place on a Tuesday lunchtime for pupils who do not have access to an electrical device which is connected to the internet on which to complete their homework.</p>	<p><b>Essentials/Daily Kit/Planner:</b> Your child needs a pencil, rubber, sharpener, 30cm ruler, green pen, coloured pencils, whiteboard pen, glue stick and blue handwriting pen, kept in <b>one small pencil case</b>. Children are encouraged to wear watches. Only small plain stud earrings may be worn. Long hair is tied back with a <b>plain small band and correct socks should be worn</b>. No nail polish. School black shoes and not trainers to be worn. Uniform must be clearly named and worn correctly.
