Our new year 3 pupils are settling in beautifully. We have been learning how to play dodgeball in PE. So far, the year 3 children have been practicing their throwing skills and working in teams to play games focusing on accuracy.



In maths we have been looking at number lines and ordering numbers. We have been using counting in 2's, 5's and 10's to help us with more challenging number lines.

Health and safety in school

We welcome the support of parents in helping us ensure that pupils at Oakfield make informed and safe choices. Class teachers will be discussing the following issues with all our pupils and parents can support us by talking about the importance of these things at home. <u>Use of Toilets</u>

In addition to practising and supervising hand washing with your child at home, please remind your child that they need to flush the toilet after every use and should only dispense enough toilet paper for their individual use. No food should be taken into or disposed of in the toilets.

If you know your child has toileting accidents please ensure you have discussed this with your child's class teacher or the office, please ensure they have spare clothes in their locker and a plastic bag to bring home wet clothes. We do keep a stock of spare clothes and underwear in the school office so please encourage your child to speak to a staff member or go to the school office if they have a toileting accident.

For girls there is a sanitary disposal bin in the furthest cubicle in the girls toilet block. There is also one in the creative cabin toilets. We keep a small quantity of spare sanitary items in the office, but please ensure your daughter has plenty of sanitary supplies plus clean underwear with them if needed.

Playground Safety

We have a lot of play equipment in the school grounds, which children are encouraged to use, under the supervision of staff. Please note that for health and safety reasons the climbing ropes on the lower playground and the outdoor gym equipment on the top playground are out of bounds to children of all ages at drop-off and pick up times. In addition, pupils are reminded not to climb up the concrete slope in front of the climbing ropes at any time.

Drop-Off and Pick Up

We encourage parents to drop off and pick up on foot wherever possible. If you do need to drive, please remember that there is no access to the staff car park for drop off or pick up at any time, unless by prior agreement due to a specific need (e.g. blue badge holders). Please drop off and pick up with consideration for other road users and pedestrians, taking great care where children will be crossing paths and roads on foot.

Important dates

1 September 2023

You can apply online for a school place.

20 October 2023

We suggest you submit your secondary application by this date as this is the Friday before the half term holiday.

31 October 2023

Closing date for secondary applications but we welcome early applications.

1 March 2024

Secondary outcomes will be sent by post or email. If you applied online, you will receive an email in the evening with the outcome and you can also view your school offer online. If you registered for ParentComms, you will also receive a notification with the outcome.

By 15 March 2024

You must confirm whether you wish to accept or decline the place you have been offered.

By 15 April 2024

For many schools, if you wish to appeal, you should submit it by this date so that it can be heard by 18 June 2024. Other schools may have different appeal deadlines.

Is your child in year 6?

If your child was born between 1 September 2012 and 31 August 2013 you will need to apply for a secondary school place by 31 October 2023.



How do I apply?

- The quickest and easiest way to apply for a school place is online.
 Visit surreycc.gov.uk/admissions to access the application form and more information on the application process and admission arrangements for Surrey schools. It is important that you consider this information carefully when you make your application.
- You can start your online application any time from 1 September 2023 but you must have completed it by 31 October 2023. We would suggest you submit your application by Friday 20 October 2023, before the halfterm holiday.
- You can download the app ParentComms to your mobile device to receive notifications about your application.
- Once you have submitted your application you will receive a confirmation email.
- On 1 March 2024 you will receive an email with the outcome of your application and, if you have registered for ParentComms, you will also receive a notification with the outcome.
- You will need to accept or decline your offer of a school place online by 15 March 2024.

What else do I need to know?

- School open days will usually be held in September or October. Please check each school's website for the most up to date information about open days or evenings. You should contact schools directly if you'd like to arrange a visit.
- You can name up to six schools on your application form, in the order that you prefer them. Where possible the local authority will allocate a place at one of these schools.
- Schools will not know where you have ranked them on the application form so the order of your preferences does not disadvantage you.
- The local authority has a duty to provide a place for your child but it does not have to be at one of your preferred schools.
- If you have an older child already at the school, you must still apply for a younger child.
- If you have more than one child applying for a school place, you must make a separate application for each of them.
- If you live in Surrey you must apply to Surrey, even if the schools you list are outside Surrey.

- Some schools may need you to submit a supplementary information form in addition to the application form. Find out more about supplementary information forms at surreycc.gov.uk/admissions.
- If you are registered for council tax you must supply the name of the borough or district and the council tax account number for the property where your child normally lives. Otherwise you will be asked to provide evidence of where your child lives.
- When applying online you must make sure that you press 'submit' at the end of your application and that you receive a confirmation email which sets out your preferences and confirms your application reference number.
- If you do not receive a confirmation email you should check your application to ensure its status has been changed to 'submitted'.
- If you write to us or submit information to support an application, remember to include your child's name, date of birth and application reference number (if you applied online).
- If your child has an education, health and care plan, there is a separate process and you will receive more information from your child's SEND Case Officer.



Is your child starting school in September 2024?

If your child was born between 1 September 2019 and 31 August 2020 you will need to apply for a school place. You can apply between **30 October 2023** and **15 January 2024**.

If you live in Surrey, you can find out all you need to know about school admissions and apply online at **surreycc.gov.uk/admissions** or you can call us on **0300 200 1004**.

Applying on time will give your child the best chance of getting one of your preferred schools.
