Year 3 have been working on activities linked to Harvest. We did leaf printing using leaves from plants growing in our allotment and we also watched a harvest presentation where we learnt about how spinach and onions grow.





Year 4 had a very interesting Zoom call with Rabbi Zvi as part of our RE topic where we learned all about the Jewish artefacts and were able to ask questions about Judaism. Year 4 showed great curiosity!





Year 4 had a fantastic day out at Bignor Roman Villa where we learned all about the history of the mosaics and took part in some fun workshops. The children behaved so well on the coach and around the villa. The leaders at the Villa said we would be welcome back any time!









Some children in Year 5 have been attending Mrs Holman's cookery enrichment class and enhancing their knowledge and life skills for healthy eating. They have learnt about different foods, their origin, and have followed recipes. Pupils were taught how to cut and chop food safely and also sketched their ingredients. They were all able to take their meals home.











Sophie from Surrey Fire Brigade came to talk to Year 5 about what causes fires

We learnt about 'The Fiery Five.'

This included what to do if there is a fire, understanding fire escape plans, and how to protect yourself if your clothes catch fire – 'Stop, Drop and Roll'.

Sophie also reminded us that we should all check our fire alarms weekly!





In Science Year 6 have been learning about how animals have adapted to survive in extreme conditions by watching David Attenborough's 'Blue Planet'.

The children have studied some fascinating creatures,

such as the 'barrel eye' and 'fang tooth' fish Lots of curiosity on display in both classes!





In the LAN Centre we made apple crumble with cinnamon and jam. Some of the children ate their crumbles with custard. We did junk modelling and sketched conkers, horse chestnut leaves and fir cones.

## Important dates

#### 1 September 2023

You can apply online for a school place.

#### 20 October 2023

We suggest you submit your secondary application by this date as this is the Friday before the half term holiday.

#### 31 October 2023

Closing date for secondary applications but we welcome early applications.

#### 1 March 2024

Secondary outcomes will be sent by post or email. If you applied online, you will receive an email in the evening with the outcome and you can also view your school offer online. If you registered for ParentComms, you will also receive a notification with the outcome.

#### By 15 March 2024

You must confirm whether you wish to accept or decline the place you have been offered.

#### By 15 April 2024

For many schools, if you wish to appeal, you should submit it by this date so that it can be heard by 18 June 2024. Other schools may have different appeal deadlines.

# Is your child in year 6?

If your child was born between 1 September 2012 and 31 August 2013 you will need to apply for a secondary school place by 31 October 2023.





# How do I apply?

- The quickest and easiest way to apply for a school place is online.
   Visit surreycc.gov.uk/admissions to access the application form and more information on the application process and admission arrangements for Surrey schools. It is important that you consider this information carefully when you make your application.
- You can start your online application any time from 1 September 2023 but you must have completed it by 31 October 2023. We would suggest you submit your application by Friday 20 October 2023, before the halfterm holiday.
- You can download the app ParentComms to your mobile device to receive notifications about your application.
- Once you have submitted your application you will receive a confirmation email.
- On 1 March 2024 you will receive an email with the outcome of your application and, if you have registered for ParentComms, you will also receive a notification with the outcome.
- You will need to accept or decline your offer of a school place online by 15 March 2024.

### What else do I need to know?

- School open days will usually be held in September or October. Please check each school's website for the most up to date information about open days or evenings. You should contact schools directly if you'd like to arrange a visit.
- You can name up to six schools on your application form, in the order that you prefer them. Where possible the local authority will allocate a place at one of these schools.
- Schools will not know where you have ranked them on the application form so the order of your preferences does not disadvantage you.
- The local authority has a duty to provide a place for your child but it does not have to be at one of your preferred schools.
- If you have an older child already at the school, you must still apply for a younger child.
- If you have more than one child applying for a school place, you must make a separate application for each of them.
- If you live in Surrey you must apply to Surrey, even if the schools you list are outside Surrey.

- Some schools may need you to submit a supplementary information form in addition to the application form. Find out more about supplementary information forms at surreycc.gov.uk/admissions.
- If you are registered for council tax you must supply the name of the borough or district and the council tax account number for the property where your child normally lives. Otherwise you will be asked to provide evidence of where your child lives.
- When applying online you must make sure that you press 'submit' at the end of your application and that you receive a confirmation email which sets out your preferences and confirms your application reference number.
- If you do not receive a confirmation email you should check your application to ensure its status has been changed to 'submitted'.
- If you write to us or submit information to support an application, remember to include your child's name, date of birth and application reference number (if you applied online).
- If your child has an education, health and care plan, there is a separate process and you will receive more information from your child's SEND Case Officer.

# Is your child starting school in September 2024?



If your child was born between 1 September 2019 and 31 August 2020 you will need to apply for a school place. You can apply between 30 October 2023 and 15 January 2024.

Applying on time will give your child the best chance of getting one of your preferred schools.
