French We will build confidence and enjoyment as we practise reading, speaking and writing French weather phrases, French travel phrases and using French conjunctions.</p>		<p>Computing: Our topics this term: using computer systems and networks and coding using Scratch; E-Safety (responsible usage) is regularly taught.</p>
<p>Homework: Children are expected to read 5x per week for 20 mins. This should be recorded in their Homework Planner and signed weekly by a parent/adult. Homework for Maths and English are set on a Monday and should be completed by Friday. Spelling lists are set weekly. Each task should take no longer than 20 minutes or longer if a child is happy to continue. On occasion, science, topic or art homework may be set. We encourage parents to support their child with their learning as much as possible. Homework club will take place on a Tuesday lunchtime for pupils who do not have access to an electrical device which is connected to the internet on which to complete their homework.</p>	<p>Essentials/Daily Kit/Planner: Your child needs a pencil, rubber, sharpener, 30cm ruler, green pen, green highlighter, coloured pencils, whiteboard pen, glue stick and blue handwriting pen, kept in one small pencil case. Children are encouraged to wear watches. Only small plain stud earrings may be worn. Long hair is tied back with a plain small band and correct socks should be worn. No nail polish. School black shoes and not trainers to be worn. Uniform must be clearly named and worn correctly.
