<p>Homework: Children are expected to read 5x per week for 20 mins. This should be recorded in their Homework Planner and signed weekly by a parent/adult. Homework for Maths and English are set on a Monday and should be completed by Friday. Spelling lists are set weekly and tested on a Friday. Each task should take no longer than 20 minutes or longer if a child is happy to continue. We encourage parents to support their child with their learning as much as possible. Homework club will take place weekly on a Tuesday lunchtime for pupils who do not have access to a device.</p>		<p>Computing: Our topics this term: Excel, PowerPoint, Word and Photo editing. E-Safety (responsible usage) is taught once every half-term.</p>
