

<p><b>English:</b> Genres for this term are: Narrative, Poetry and Explanation texts. SPAG (Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation) lessons are taught weekly as part of English lessons. Whole class Guided Reading sessions are held daily. The year 3/4 statutory spelling list can be found in the back of the pupil planner. <b>Spellings are set every week</b> as part of the English homework and <b>will be tested on the Wednesday-Hazel Class &amp; Thursday-Holly Class after they are set.</b> Reading – our reading scheme is extensive. <b>All pupils are expected to read at least 5 times a week and record this in their planner.</b></p>	<p><b>Science:</b> Our topics for this term are: Forces and Magnets Plants There are useful resources on the BBC website. <a href="http://www.bbc.co.uk/schools/ks2bitesize/science/">http://www.bbc.co.uk/schools/ks2bitesize/science/</a></p>	<p><b>Maths:</b> Classes will cover the following: multiplication &amp; division, fractions, shape and measurement Learning times tables is a key homework focus for Spring and Summer term. Tables will be set as part of maths homework and tested on the Friday after they are set. <b>Reminder:</b> All children are subscribed to TTRockstars and Doodle Maths online so please encourage them to use it! Passwords and Usernames are in planners.</p> <p><b>PE:</b> PE kit should be worn on days where children have PE, which is Thursday. Plimsolls for indoor PE sessions and trainers for outdoor are expected. Navy tracksuits are allowed in colder months. Please ensure that earrings are removed before the PE lesson. PE sweatshirts are available at the Kit shop in Fetcham.</p>

<p><b>Homework:</b> Children should read daily for 15 minutes and record this in their planner. Every Monday, they will be set 1 English piece of homework which will be due the following Monday. A weekly maths task will be set on Friday to be completed by the following Thursday. Each task should take 15 minutes or longer if a child is happy to continue. On occasion, other subject homework may be set. Homework planners should be in school every day and signed at the end of each week by an adult at home. We encourage parents to support their child with their learning as much as possible. <b>Homework Club</b> takes place on Tuesday during lunchtime for those pupils who do not have access to a device, which connects to the internet at home. Any children who have not completed their homework will be asked to attend homework club to complete it.</p>	<p><b>Computing:</b> The skills that we are focussing on this term are: PowerPoint, Typing skills, E-safety and computing systems and networks</p> <p><b>Essentials/Daily Kit/Planner:</b> Your child needs a pencil, rubber, sharpener, 30cm ruler, green pen, coloured pencils, whiteboard pen, glue stick and blue handwriting pen, kept in <b>one small pencil case in school</b>. Children are encouraged to wear watches. Only small plain stud earrings may be worn. Long hair is tied back with a <b>plain small band and correct socks should be worn</b>. No nail polish. Uniform must be clearly named and worn correctly.
